#### Each one Reach one!

The act of evangelism is the Spirit led communication of the good news of God in such a way or ways that the recipients have a valid opportunity to accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, and to become a responsible member of his or her church.

Jesus said to his disciples in Matthew 28:19-20 "go ye therefore and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost; teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world".

In the book of Acts we see how the early church started out as just a flicker and how it turned into a wildfire spreading the gospel throughout the known world. Beginning in Jerusalem with a small group of disciples, the message traveled across the Roman Empire. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, this courageous little group preached, taught, healed, and demonstrated **love** in synagogues, schools, homes, marketplaces, and courtrooms, and on streets, hills, ships and desert roads. Wherever God sent them, lives and history were changed!

The message they proclaimed seemed foolish, and the messengers were unimpressive. These early Christians had no political influence and little money. They didn't even own church buildings but met in homes. And to make matters worse, wherever they went, they were persecuted for their faith, yet the church continued to grow.

There was something magnetic about the church. Many of the Christians lived in the crowded cities of the Roman Empire. This provided an opportunity for people to see firsthand how the followers of Jesus lived on a daily basis, and what they observed was attractive.

Most of us are able to keep clear in our minds the origin and goal of Christian ministry. Its origin is in Christ, who gives spiritual gifts and gifted people to the church. Its goal is the building of the body of Christ in knowledge, faith and love. Less clear is the living, dynamic, God-appointed process that moves from origin to goal. Notice carefully what the following verses teach us. God gives to the church spiritual leaders whose role it is to equip saints for ministry.

The Apostle Paul echoes this truth in Ephesians 4:11-13: "The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ."

God's pattern for producing people with powerful faith and genuine love is not to have the pastor -teachers do all the work of the ministry. They are to equip the saints to do the ministry. They are you—all of you—who have set yourselves apart for God through faith in Christ. According to God's pattern, the building of the body in faith and love is the immediate result of the ministry of the laity.

The Lord Jesus Christ intends every member of the church to do the work of the ministry. The intention of ministry is to build up each other's faith and love. God's design is to use human support and encouragement to sustain the faith of his children and to lighten the burdens they bear in the service of love.

The America for Christ Offering (AFC) 2018 reminds us that it is in our service to the church and the community that many experience the Christ in us. We are encourage by this year's theme to come alongside people and build them up. I am asking you to join me in giving generously to this year's AFC offering and help us to reach our goal as we partner in home mission.
